

<b>Title:</b>	WHO Age Friendly Cities and Communities Network

<b>Purpose/Key Messages:</b>	<p>The Age Friendly Cities and Communities initiative is an international programme of the World Health Organisation (WHO).</p> <p>The Older People's Council spearheaded the campaign for Brighton &amp; Hove to join the AFC programme, supported by AgeUK Brighton &amp; Hove, Pensioner Action, Community Service Volunteers (CSV), the FED, Carer's Support, the Alzheimer's Society and public health.</p> <p>The initiative will help Brighton &amp; Hove improve the city's offer to its older residents, something to which the council and partners are committed. The AFC programme is a key objective in the council's corporate plan and also aligns to the One Planet City initiative.</p> <p>There is a UK Network of Age Friendly Cities, Brighton and Hove is a member city.</p>

<p><b>Significance to BHSP and Delivering SCS outcomes:</b></p>	<p>The initiative takes the form of a five year programme, which includes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Establishment of mechanisms to involve older people throughout the cycle</li> <li>2. Development of a baseline assessment of the age-friendliness of the city, using the eight domains identified in the WHO Age-friendly Cities Guide available at (<a href="#">Global Age-friendly Cities: A Guide</a>) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• outdoor spaces and buildings,</li> <li>• transportation,</li> <li>• housing,</li> <li>• social participation,</li> <li>• respect and social inclusion,</li> <li>• civic participation and employment,</li> <li>• communication and information, and</li> <li>• community support and health services.</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. Development of a 3-year city-wide action plan based on the findings of this assessment.</li> <li>4. Identification of indicators to monitor progress against this plan.</li> </ol>
<p><b>What is BHSP being asked to do?</b></p>	<p>Brighton &amp; Hove City Council has brought together a range of key local agencies and older people's groups to act as a steering group for the initiative. This group is steering the baseline assessment.</p> <p>Work on the assessment has commenced, using the eight WHO domains. We are keen to discuss our findings with the various LSP partnership groups.</p>
<p><b>Next steps and report back mechanism:</b></p>	<p>Once the city assessment is complete, the next stage will be to develop a plan to address issues identified.</p> <p>The Age Friendly City Steering Group meets regularly.
